

Bio for Tracy Robinson

Tracy Robinson is a Senior Lecturer in the Faculty of Law, University of the West Indies (UWI) Mona, Jamaica where she teaches undergraduate courses in Constitutional Law, Commonwealth Caribbean Human Rights Law and Family Law. She joined Mona Law in 2011 after teaching for a decade and a half at the Faculty of Law, UWI, Cave Hill. At The UWI, she is a co-founder and co-coordinator of the Faculty of Law, The UWI, Rights Advocacy Project (U-RAP), which works to promote human rights and social justice in the Caribbean through strategic litigation, legal education and research.

Her recent publications include the co-authored article with Arif Bulkan, "Constitutional comparisons by a supranational court in flux: The JCPC and Caribbean bills of rights" published in (2017) *Modern Law Review*; the co-authored text with Bulkan and the Hon. Justice Adrian Saunders, *Fundamentals of Caribbean Constitutional Law* (Sweet & Maxwell 2015); and the co-edited book with Berry, *Transitions in Caribbean Law: Lawmaking Constitutionalism and the Confluence of National and International Law* (Ian Randle 2013).

She has authored and co-authored many regional expert reports on the law related to gender, sexuality and human rights in the Caribbean and has been involved in legal and policy reform aimed at furthering gender equality and children's rights in the Caribbean. She has also been involved in judicial education for courts serving Barbados, Guyana, Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago and the OECS, on the themes of human rights, access to justice and gender equality.

Between 2012 and 2015, she served a four-year term as a member of the seven-person Inter American Commission on Human Rights (IACHR). She was the IACHR's President between March 2014 and March 2015. In 2016, she was appointed a Commissioner on the recently established WHO/PAHO led Independent Review of Equity and Health Inequalities in the Americas.
