Paul Moxey is a Visiting Professor of Corporate Governance at London South Bank University and the former head of the Corporate Governance and Risk Management at the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants ("ACCA"). Paul focusses on the overlap between culture, governance, business ethics and uncertainty and how these affect performance. Recently in 2016, Paul researched how corporate incentives, both formal and informal, affect corrupt behaviour. His research included talking to executives and compliance officers in many companies and he then wrote the book: *'Transparency International report Incentivising Ethics - Managing incentives to encourage good and deter bad behaviour'*. In this seminar, Professor Moxey will discuss critical elements of Bribery, Corruption and Incentives.
