BIG WINNERS: Club Sando's Under-14 F

Campbell Club Sando's first YP

FORWARD Omari Campbell : a quick-fire hat-trick and Club Under-14s celebrated their first the Flow 2018 Youth Pro League three attempts with a 9-0 beat Central FC last Sunday on Match Three at the Manny Ramjohn Stadium training field in Marabella.

Campbell scored in the 26th and 35th minutes for a first-half hat-trick after Joshua Mason opened the scoring in the 10th minute for head coach Caesar's young Oranges.

Zico Correia later completed the hat-trick, scoring on either side of the ball in the 28th and 49th minutes and set up Campbell's third goal and a 39th minute Jaylon Brereton strike, before Griffith (59th) and Joshua Kesney completed the comfortable win with the tone for victories by the club's Under-16 and Under-18 outfits later in the day.

Sando's U16s, coached by Keo also grabbed their first win of the Flow 2018 campaign, maintaining their unbeaten status with a 3-0 over Central thanks to first half goals by Ephraim Brown (11th), Jean-Henri Fec (24th) and Nirvan Ramnarine.

Sando U18s, coached by first coach Angus Eve, then completed the day with a 5-0 mauling of Central FC.

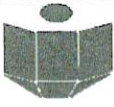
Isa Bramble (1st & 21st) and Rawlins (23rd & 78th) both scored for Sando U18s before Akeel (90th) completed the rout to lift Sando's Under-18s to second place in the Under-18 standings, level on six points with third-placed W Connection and one point behind leaders San Juan Jabloteh's U18 game against Fortin Civic was abandoned by rain in the 69th minute, due to interference by Jabloteh supporters at the Oval, with the score at 0-0 and both sides reduced to 10 men after Asukile (Jabloteh) and Kidane Lewis (Fortin Civic) saw direct red cards in separate incidents in the second half.

Jabloteh, however, had defeated Fortin Civic 3-0 in the Under-14 game with Kanye Baker, Jaheim Faus and Israel Joseph finding the back of the net. But Jabloteh's Under-16s were held to a 1-1 draw by Civic before the Under-16s also had to settle for a point.

Elsewhere, W Connection's Under-16 game against hosts Defence Force FC was one of four FYPL games cancelled.
