Granger and commission in elections talk

\L GEORGETOWN

A MEETING has been scheduled for today be-tween Guyanese President David Granger and commissioners of the Guyana Elections Commission (GECOM) to discuss issues related to the upcoming general election,

In a statement on Wednesday, Granger signalled his intention to meet with the commission to better understand its readiness and needs for the hosting of early elections, which have been triggered by that December 21, 2018 no-confidence vote.
"GECOM is an au-

tonomous, GECOM is an independent agency and there is no part in the constitution which gives the president or the executive in general authority to interfere, intervene or intrude in the work of the Elec-Commission... tions we are moving towards elections, but GECOM is in charge of elections, not the executive. I cannot decide when elections will be held, GECOM has to advise".

According GECOM, it cannot hold credible elections within that time frame as being suggested by the main opposition People's Progressive Party (PPP) and has suggest-ed the polls could most

initially indicated his unwillingness to attend the talks unless several proposals which he had outlined had been accepted, but late Tuesday night relented saying "members of the diplomatic corps asked to make one last attempt to avert the constitutional crisis that the president, with a com-plicit GECOM is leading our nation into".

Jagdeo has been calling for fresh regional and general elections to be held by March 19 in keeping with the provisions of the Guyana constitution.

The opposition lead er has said his party will lend its support for that two-thirds majority if the timeline is not in the distant future. He believes elections could be held by the end of April.
